

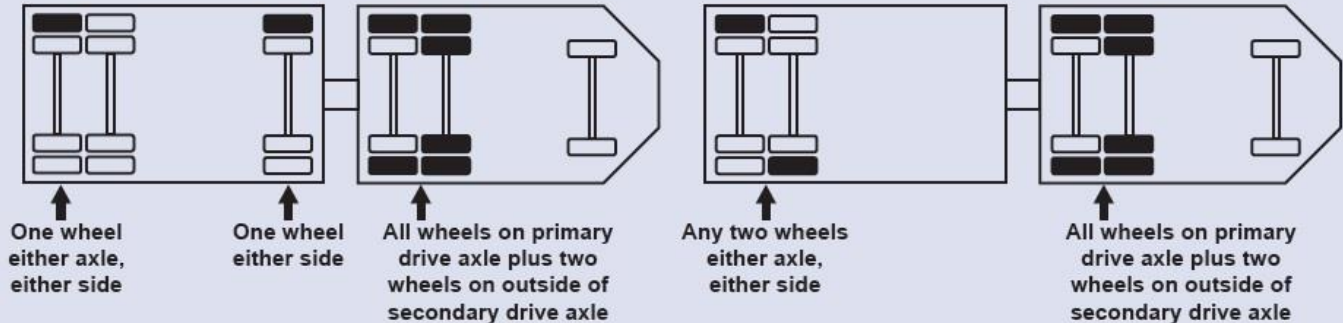
STATE CHAIN REQUIREMENTS

CHAINING DIAGRAM

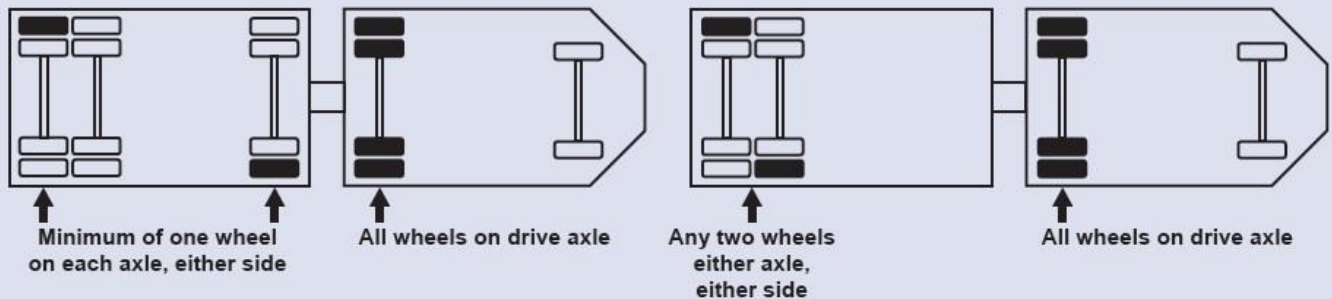
DUAL AXLE:

ONE SET OF LINK COVERING THE OUTSIDE TIRES ON PRIMARY DRIVE AXLE, ALL OTHER POSITIONS CAN BE CABLE



SINGLE AXLE:

LINK CHAIN REQUIRED ON ALL DRIVE TIRES
